NOTABLE CASES

Li v. 1083195 B.C. Ltd. 2022 BCSC 2063

- Counsel for a real estate developer in relation to the sale of a pre-sale condominium where the buyer sought to cancel the contract prior to an occupancy permit being issued for the development. The Court found the buyer continued to be bound by the contract.

Ambroziewicz v Zhang 2022 BCSC 2109

- Counsel for the seller in a residential real estate sale where the buyer refused to release the deposit to the seller after failing to complete the purchase due to the purchaser being subject to the Foreign Buyer's Tax.
